Nadine Menendez Found Guilty on All Counts In Bribery Case

A Manhattan jury on Monday found Nadine Menendez, wife of disgraced ex-U.S. Sen. Robert Menendez, guilty on all counts in her bribery case.

The verdict follows a threeweek trial and approximately seven hours of deliberations.

U.S. District Court Judge Sidney Stein set sentencing for June 12, mere days after her husband is expected to surrender to prison to begin serving his 11-year sentence.

Menendez and her husband, who was elected to three terms in the Senate as a New Jersey Democrat, were indicted in 2023. Prosecutors allege they accepted bribes-including gold bars, envelopes of cash and a Mercedes-Benz convertible—in exchange for providing favors. The duo, who pleaded not guilty, were indicted on charges including conspiracy to commit bribery, conspiracy to commit honest services fraud, and conspiracy to commit extortion under color of official right.

Robert Menendez was also convicted of acting as an agent for the Egyptian government. He resigned from the Senate following his conviction but maintains his innocence.

Nadine Menendez, prosecutors said, acted as the gobetween for her husband, then the head of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, and New Jersey businessmen Fred Daibes and Wael Hana. Daibes and Hana were convicted at trial. A third man, Jose Uribe, pleaded guilty and cooperated with prosecutors.

"Nadine Menendez agreed to accept and accepted all sorts of bribes—including gold bars, cash, a Mercedes-Benz convertible, and a no-show job—all in exchange for the Senator's corrupt official acts," Acting U.S. Attorney for the Southern District of New York Matthew Podolsky said in a statement. "Together, Nadine Menendez and the Senator placed their own interests and greed ahead of the interests of the citizens the Senator was elected to serve."

Ex-Katten Partner Alleges Age Bias in \$67M Lawsuit

A former partner at Katten Muchin Rosenman has filed a \$67 million lawsuit against the firm and executive leadership, alleging age discrimination.

In a pro se complaint, 62-year-old Stewart Herman alleged Katten CEO Noah Heller and the firm's general counsel, Michael Verde, chipped away at his "successful" practice group before eliminating it altogether

Herman says the aircraftfinance practice was targeted because he and the other partner, Timothy Lyons, were in their 60s.

In a statement, Katten denied the allegations as "baseless."

The suit alleges Heller and Verde asked Herman to resign because the firm's malpractice insurer believed his age created malpractice-related risks.

Herman says that, after he refused to resign, Heller and Verde started a retaliatory campaign to "coerce and deceive" him into resigning, thereby waiving his pension and waiving his rights.

"They knowingly falsely told me I was not entitled to the benefit of federal or state anti-discrimination law and told me my only choice was to resign within a short period and waive my rights, or be fired immediately," the complaint states.

The suit alleges the firm had a strong incentive, following loss of revenue in 2022, to not let partners retire and collect their pensions.

When he refused to resign, Katten allegedly suspended him without pay, barred him from taking new clients and blocked him from attending industry conferences.

New York's Top Court Boosts Productivity, Deciding 120 Appeals in 2024

NEW YORK'S top court decided 120 appeals in 2024, a big jump during Chief Judge Rowan Wilson first full year at the helm, while also closing in on pre-pandemic caseloads.

It was an increase of more than 25% from 2023, when the top court decided 88 cases, preceded by 91 decisions in 2022, 81 in 2021, and

Wilson was elevated to chief judge in April 2023. Soon after, he vowed to increase what he had said was the court's "embarrassingly low casel-

The 75 civil and 45 criminal cases decided in 2024 easily exceeded the 52 civil and 36 criminal cases decided in 2023.

Caseloads dwindled significantly during former Chief Judge Janet DiFiore's tenure from 2016 to August 2022. During her first year, it decided 225 cases, before eventually dropping to what was believed to be an all-time low caseload in 2021.

According to the report, Wilson attributed the increase to "calendaring more cases and prospectively vouching-in Appellate Division Justices when one or more Judges of the Court could not participate in an appeal."

\$69M Meme Token Meltdown 96 in 2020.

INVESTORS in the \$M3M3 meme coin filed a class action complaint in Manhattan federal court Monday against the group that operates Meteora, alleging that the defendants "covertly" controlled almost the entire supply of the token before and soon after opening trading to the public, cashed out at an inflated price and left the plaintiffs with heavy losses.

Max Burwick of Burwick Law and Margaret Hoppin and Timothy Grinsell of Hoppin Grinsell represent the plaintiffs, Jonathan Clarke and Rodrigo Ferreira Da Cruz Vogt, in their suit against defendants Meteora, its CEO Benjamin Chow and the venture capital firm Kelsier Labs, which is operated by Hayden Davis, Gideon Davis and Charles Davis.

"Insiders are accused of locking public buyers out for the first minutes of trading, securing 95% of the tokens and later selling at a premium," Burwick alleged in a statement. "The complaint asks the court to classify stake-based meme tokens as securities and to appoint a receiver over Meteora, steps that could influence how any new celebrity or political token is brought to market on Solana."

The defendants did not respond to a request for comment.

For Big Law Firms Making Deals With Trump, Effect on Partner Recruiting May Be Muted, For Now

TALENT is the lifeblood of Big Law. But recruiters and analysts insist they still don't know whether or which direction that talent will stream, after nine Big Law firms made pro bono deals with President Donald Trump to avoid an executive order and four other firms face Trump's executive

There have been several reports of lawyers, especially associates, leaving their firms after leaders agreed to deals with the Trump administration, and increasing uncertainty whether Trump will attempt to force these law firms to perform pro bono work that is outside the bounds of their deals.

But multiple sources say, despite plenty of noise, they haven't seen



large recruiting fallout, especially in the partner ranks. There's been "a lot of buzz, a lot of talk," said Alisa Levin, a New York-based recruiter from Greene-Levin-Snyder Legal Search Group. But "not a lot of action yet."

Companies Suing Over Mass Arbitration, Saying It's Unethical

AS MORE plaintiffs firms have embraced mass arbitration, companies are fighting back with lawsuits that challenge both the validity of the claims and the ethics of the lawyers.

Streaming service Tubi, children's clothing retailer Janie and Jack and videogame maker Sega are among the companies suing plaintiffs' firms that filed thousands of arbitration claims against them. With millions of dollars in arbitration fees at stake, companies have targeted firms such as Chicago's Keller Postman, Zimmerman Reed

and Consovoy McCarthy in Washington, D.C.

The lawsuits come as more plaintiffs firms have pursued mass arbitration. The cases raise an assortment of alleged ethical concerns, including the methods in which plaintiffs firms use social media to find clients, and how their lawyers fail to communicate with clients as required under professional codes of conduct. They point to claimants that do not exist, do not have injuries, were not customers, or did not know they even had an attorney. "There is some collective frustra-

tion with it, with utilizing the mass arbitration platform to extract settlements under the threat of higher fees," Morrison & Foerster partner

Krista deBoer told Law.com, "and folks are frustrated by the fact that a lot of these claims aren't valid, and they're being forced to settle claims that aren't valid.'

Plaintiffs firms, she said, should do a better job of vetting their mass arbitration clients, most of whom have documentation since they signed up for a service or have a payment receipt or email. "But, instead, they say, 'by

checking this box, or by typing your name in, you are verifying that you're qualified for this claim,' without requiring more of the claimant," she said. "They're trusting them to tell the truth and saying, 'it's not our fault

Trump Sees Loper Bright Decision as 'Blank Check To Deregulate,' Law Professor Says

THE TRUMP administration last week proposed changing the environmentally friendly definition of "harm" in the Endangered Species Act, saying it could do so in part because a 1995 Supreme Court decision upholding the definition invalidly relied on the since-overturned Chevron deference to federal agencies.

The administration cited the high court's 2024 Chevron-ending decision *Loper Bright Enterprises v. Raimondo* to say the Interior Department's existing interpretation of the act's use of the word "harm" is now open to reconsideration, the administration said.

But legal experts said last week that *Loper Bright* likely applies prospectively and generally cannot be cited to undue regulations that were upheld during the Chevron era from 1984 to 2024.

Jay Austin, senior attorney at the Environmental Law Institute, said Chief Justice John Roberts Jr.'s majority opinion in *Loper Bright* suggested that stare decisis applies

to decisions made using Chevron deference and cannot be casually overturned. At a minimum, the administration would have to articulate why a new reading of the statute should supplant what was decided in the earlier court ruling, Austin added.

Any litigation regarding a change to the definition of "harm" could test the bounds of stare decisis under *Loper Bright*, Austin said.

"It's maybe one of the first big environmental law tests—not only what the *Loper Bright* decision means, but specifically what did the court mean when it talked about statutory stare decisis," he added.

The Endangered Species Act makes it illegal to "harass, harm, pursue, hunt, shoot, wound, kill, trap, capture, or collect" endangered species. The Interior Department has further defined "harm" as "significant habitat modification or degradation where it actually kills or injures wildlife."

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service—an Interior Department agency—has proposed limiting the definition of "harm" to apply only to the direct killing or harming of an endangered species and not to significant habitat modifications or degradations that lead to death or injury.

Environmentalists have opposed such a definitional change, saying it would enable industrial development—a habitat modification—on land now reserved for the protection of endangered species.

The Supreme Court upheld the existing harm definition 20 years ago in Babbitt v. Sweet Home Chapter of Communities for a Great Oregon

In proposing it new definition, the Fish and Wildlife Service acknowledged the *Sweet Home* ruling, Chevron deference and the role *Loper Bright* now plays.

"[U]nder the then prevailing *Chevron* framework, *Sweet Home* held only that the existing regulation is a permissible reading of the ESA, not the only possible such reading," the proposed regulation stated. "Our rescission of the regulation definition on the ground that it does not reflect the best reading of the statutory text thus would not only effectuate the Executive Branch's obligation to 'take Care that the Laws be faithfully executed,' but would also be fully consistent with *Sweet Home*."

George Washington University law professor Paul Schiff Berman said an agency can always revise its interpretation of the law if it provides proper legal justification for it.

But the *Loper Bright* decision does not push agency actions in either a regulatory or deregulatory direction, and the administration wrongly views the ruling as "a blank check to deregulate," he said.

Lewis & Clark Law School professor Daniel Rohlf said the high court in *Sweet Home* closely read read the statute and did not rely all that much on Chevron deference, as the administration seems to suggest. A court could draw the same conclusions and come to the same decision even with a new judicial review framework under *Loper Bright*, he added.

Jarryd Page, a staff attorney at the Environmental Law Institute, said the end of Chevron deference could ultimately hurt the administration's effort to change the definition.

"The agency here says they're advancing a new legal interpretation, right?" Page said. "And it's important to know that *Loper Bright* is such that they're not going to get any deference on that legal interpretation. It really is sort of opening the door to the judge who's deciding the case to figure out what's going on here and decide what the best meaning of 'harm' is."

US Judge Blocks Massive Reduction-in-Force Plan Affecting CFPB Employees

A FEDERAL trial court for the second time blocked the Trump administration from laying off hundreds of Consumer Financial Protection Bureau employees during a show-cause hearing Friday.

U.S. District Senior Judge Amy Berman Jackson of the District of Columbia issued a bench ruling Friday preventing mass layoffs at the CFPB as she demands additional information behind the government's sudden reduction-in-force plan.

Jackson, who previously issued a preliminary injunction prohibiting the White House from dismantling the CFPB, scheduled an evidentiary hearing for April 28 to further assess whether the CFPB's 90% workforce-reduction plan can proceed under existing court orders prohibiting arbitrary "work stoppages" at the regulatory agency.

Friday's show-cause hearing took place after counsel for the plaintiffs filed an emergency motion Thursday urging Jackson to review the government's RIF plan. Deepak Gupta, founding principal of Gupta Wessler, represents a variety of plaintiffs in the case, including CFPB labor unions. He welcomed Jackson's bench ruling Friday.

"In violation of a court order, the Trump Administration just tried to reduce the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau's staff by 90% in 24 hours," Gupta said in a statement. "It's unfathomable that this rushed, across-the-board action would not interfere with the Bureau's ability to meet its legal obligations. We're pleased that the court put an immediate halt to this violation today and we look forward to continuing to press our case in court."

Cutting the CFPB's workforce from about 1,700 employees to 200 would not violate court orders, the government argues.

Mark R. Paoletta, chief legal officer for the CFPB, in a sworn statement said the government had sent reduction-in-force notices to hundreds of affected employees after determining the CFPB can perform its statutorily required functions with a much smaller staff.

Jackson granted a preliminary injunction March 28 preventing the Trump administration from dismantling the CFPB.

The U.S. Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit granted a partial stay April 11 pausing some of Jackson's preliminary injunction order from taking effect.

The D.C. Circuit stayed major parts of Jackson's ruling but allowed some parts of her preliminary injunction to remain in effect, including a requirement that CFPB "work stoppages" are prohibited unless the defendants first conduct

a "particularized assessment" and determine a stop-work policy decision "would not interfere with the performance of defendants' statutory duties."

Paoletta in his sworn statement filed Friday declared he and two other CFPB attorneys have "conducted a particularized assessment to determine which employees are unnecessary for the Bureau to perform its statutory duties."

This assessment determined the CFPB can maintain its statutorily required functions with a substantially reduced workforce, according to Paoletta's declaration.

"An approximately 200 person agency allows the Bureau to ful-fill its statutory duties and better aligns with the new leadership's priorities and management philosophy," Paoletta wrote in his sworn statement.

U.S. Department of Justice attorneys for President Donald Trump's CFPB intend to defend the merits of the government's workforce-reduction plan, which align with the objectives of the White House and Department of Government Efficiency.

"At President Trump's direction, Elon Musk and DOGE are saving historic amounts of taxpayer money from being spent on bureaucratic pet projects," a DOJ spokesperson said Friday. "This Department has already been fighting in court to vigorously defend President Trump's agenda and will continue to do so, especially when it comes to the efficient spending of taxpayer dollars."

The National Treasury Employees Union is the lead plaintiff in the case seeking to prevent mass terminations and work stoppages affecting CFPB workers. The NTEU is represented by in-house counsel, Gupta Wessler and Public Citizen Litigation Group.

Today's bench order from Judge Jackson is a vindication for NTEU and its members, who wholeheartedly contend that the administration's abrupt and chaotic RIF process does not serve the American people and is a deep violation of the rights of CFPB employees," NTEU National President Doreen Greenwald said Friday in a statement. "Cutting over 80% of CFPB staff is not only unwise, it's a direct attack on the financial security of millions of Americans. We will continue to advocate on behalf of the American people and NTEU members in court in response to President Trump's war on civil servants and we aim to demonstrate that these frenzied, thoughtless attempts to shutter agencies that have done nothing but faithfully serve the American people are a detriment to the public good."

Meta Paid Wilmer \$48M in 2024, Bringing Fees Over 3 Years to \$190M

WILMER Cutler Pickering Hale and Dorr received about \$48 million in fees last year from Meta, the social media giant disclosed in a new Securities and Exchange Commission filing.

That's a 40% decline from the \$78 million in fees it received in 2023 and a 28% drop from the \$67 million it received in 2022

million it received in 2022.

The tab that major public companies run up with outside law firms rarely slides into public view. However, Meta was obligated to disclose the extent of its Wilmer dealings to comply with SEC rules governing potential conflicts of interest, including the one it faces: having an attorney on its board of



directors whose law firm receives a gusher of fees from the company.

That director is Robert Kimmitt.

That director is Robert Kimmitt, 77, a former U.S. ambassador to Germany who for the last 16 years has served as senior international counsel of Wilmer.

Since joining the Meta board in 2000, Kimmitt has served as lead independent director, a role that includes presiding over executive sessions of the board, working with Chair Mark Zuckerberg to set board meeting agendas and serving as the primary liaison between independent directors and Zuckerberg.

Meta's new SEC filing did not put Wilmer's fees in dollar terms. Instead, it said the fees represented "approximately 3%" of Wilmer's 2024 revenue. The American Lawyer reported last week that Wilmer's revenue for the year was \$1.60 billion, up 6.9% from 2023.

In the SEC filing, Meta noted that Kimmitt has not provided any legal services to Meta since becoming a director and does not receive any compensation from the firm that is generated by or related to Meta's payments to Wilmer.

In addition, Meta said that Wilmer implemented measures to ensure that Kimmitt is walled off from any legal representation of Meta undertaken by the firm.

Further, Meta said, "Our compensation, nominating & governance committee is satisfied that WilmerHale, when engaged for legal work, is chosen by our company's legal group on the basis of the directly relevant factors of experience, expertise, and efficiency.

Ambassador Kimmitt does not have influence over the selection of our company's legal counsel."

Meta said that it hires Wilmer

from "time to time and in the ordi-

nary course of its business," but did not specify the matters.

However, one major matter is its representation of Meta in the Fodoral Trade Commission's anti-

its representation of Meta in the Federal Trade Commission's antitrust lawsuit accusing the company of monopolizing the social media market.

The trial began Monday and is expected to last about two months. Also representing Meta are Kellogg, Hansen, Todd, Figel & Frederick; Cravath, Swaine & Moore; and Davis Polk & Wardwell.

A recent decision from the Appellate Division, First Department, Allied World Natl. Assu. Co. v. AIG Specialty Ins. Co., 234 AD3d 584 (1st Dept. 2025), addresses this issue, albeit briefly, suggests a rethinking of the issues presented is worthwhile now.

This is especially so as a bill was introduced in the State Senate on March 5, 2025, S.6128, by Senator Hoylman-Sigal which addresses the issues not only in the context of a witness or deponent in preparing for the trial or deposition, but also while testifying at the trial or deplsition.

Of note, this bill was introduced at the last legislative session with the support of the New York State Bar Association and its Committee on Civil Practices and Rules, which drafted the bill. Revisiting the issue in the broader context of the Senator's bill is in order.

Under well-established New York common law, the use of any document or writing to refresh the recollection of a testifying witness, either at a trial or deposition, triggers an automatic disclosure of the document or writing to an adverse party. See Guide to New York Evidence (GNYE) Rule 6.08 (2); Hutter, Review of Privileged Documents in Trial and Deposition, 38 Pace L. Rev. 437, 472-473 (2018).

As stated by a New York court: "The right of a party to protection against the introduction against him of false, forged or manufactured evidence, which he is not permitted to inspect, must not be invoked a hair's breadth.

It is too valuable to be trifled with, or to permit the court to enter into any calculation as to how far it may be encroached upon without injury to the party." *Tibbetts v.* Sternberg, 66 Barb. 201, 203 (1870). Notably, while the Court of

Third, use of attorneyclient or attorney opinion work product privileged writings to refresh recollection does not waive the privileges attached to the writing.

Appeals has not addressed the issue of whether a right of disclosure extends to documents and writings used to refresh a witness or deponent before testifying, the Appellate Division departments held the right does so extend. GNYE 6.08, Note, p. 2.

When the right of inspection is triggered, an issue will arise when the party using a document or writing claims that disclosure is nonetheless barred because the document or writing contains materials which are protected from disclosure under statutory provi-

CPLR 319 establishes three categories of protected materials.

They are: (1) confidential communications protected by statutory privileges pursuant to CPLR 3101 (b), which are absolutely immune from discovery, albeit subject to certain limited exceptions; (2) materials derived from an attorney's professional skills and judg-

ment which are absolutely immune from discovery pursuant to CPLR 3101 (c), referred to as attorney opinion work product; and (3) trial preparation materials, sometimes referred to as fact work product, which are subject to disclosure only on a showing of substantial need and undue hardship pursuant to CPLR 3101 (d) (2).

The Court of Appeals has instructed that the burden of establishing immunity from disclosure under these provisions is with the party asserting it; and the immunity claimed must be narrowly construed and its application consistent with the purposes underlying the immunity. Forman v. Henkin, 30 NY3d 656, 661-662 (2018).

The absolute disclosure rule intersects with these three privileges. As the Court of Appeals has not addressed the issue of when, if ever, the disclosure rule requires the disclosure of documents and writings immune from disclosure under any of these privileges, the present applicable appellate authority emanates from the Appellate Division departments but they do not address all aspects of the issue, and when they do the decisions are conflicting.

The starting point is Allied World. The issue in this insurance overage action arose when defendant Ironshore Specialty Ins. Co. deposed plaintiff Endurance American Ins. Co.'s corporate designee pursuant to CPLR §3106 (d), Uniform Rule 202.20-d (f), and Commercial Division Rule 11-f (f).

At his deposition, as pertinent to the issue, the designee testified, as ascertained from the Record on Appeal, that prior to his deposition he reviewed all of the claim notes in the company files to prepare for his deposition.

He further testified "yes" when asked, "[w]as the purpose of looking through your claim notes to prepare, refresh your recollection for today's deposition?" The claim notes were produced but they did not include claimed privileged communications between Endurance representatives and coverage counsel which were redacted.

Should CPS Be the Sole Decider Of Child Abuse?

child is brought to the emergency room with an injury. Was it caused by abuse? When investigated by the police, hospital staff, and child protective services (CPS), each entity may view the same events differently, but the sole and final decisionmaker is CPS. From the perspective of a layper-

son, this may be puzzling. Police are rigorously trained in detecting illegal behavior. Nurses and doctors spend years gaining practical experience in determining how injuries occur.

Of course, the CPS investigator will consult with other relevant entities, but why does a CPS worker have the last word?

The New York City Administration for Children's Services (ACS) represents that prospective CPS job applicants will:

- Complete community visits to investigate allegations of abuse and/or neglect.
- Engage in a strength based approach with families in order to assess their individual and collective strengths and needs.
- Interview family members and others who interact with the family to assess child safety and well-being.
- Assess the risk of future abuse or neglect of children in the family.
- Coordinate a team of family members, staff and service providers to evaluate safety and identify interventions that can reduce risks to children.
- Remove child(ren) into protective custody or foster care, when children are found to be in imminent danger.
- Enter and maintain accurate and timely computerized
- Help families navigate gov-

Multidisciplinary Approaches to Child Abuse Investigations

When making a determination about whether a child's injury results from abuse or accident, relying solely on CPS to make the final decision can raise concerns about the accuracy and fairness

Given the incredibly high stakes - ensuring child safety while protecting families from wrongful accusations – a collaboration approach may prove more effective. Research suggests that multidisciplinary teams (MDTs) improve outcomes in child abuse investigations.

MDTs typically consist of professionals ranging from law enforcement, healthcare, social services, mental health, and legal experts. One could expect to find a wide-ranging array of professionals working together on an MDT, including assistant district attorneys, witness advocates, forensic interviewers, detectives, doctors,


therapists, and MDT coordinators. These teams work together to gather and interpret evidence, and ultimately ensure that no single perspective dominates the decisionmaking process. As early as 1978, the U.S. Department of Justice released a special report from the National Center of Child Abuse and Neglect finding that multidisciplinary teams "give better service more economically and effectively, and reduce the number of reinjured children."

Healthcare professionals like forensic nurses and child abuse pediatricians have specialized training in distinguishing between accidental injuries, and traumatic injuries resulting from abuse.

The American Academy of Pediatrics reports that incorrect assumptions about bruising patterns, fracture, or burns, can lead to either the wrongful removal of a child or the failure to protect a child in danger. A multidisciplinary model ensures that medical expertise is integrated into the investigative process, rather than being secondary to CPS assessments.

To enhance the accuracy of child abuse investigations, policymakers must consider implementing formal MDTs for all cases involving serious allegations of abuse. This model has already been successfully adopted into child advocacy centers across the country, where specialists from different fields collaborate on investigations.

Ultimately, the goal of child welfare investigations should be to protect children from harm while ensuring due process for families. Rather than leaving the final determination solely in the hands of CPS, a consensus-based system among key stakeholders could provide children with a much more balanced and just outcome.

Arps, Slate, Meagher & Flom; and Milbank—have made agreements with Trump, pledging at least \$940 million, combined, in pro bono services to causes his administration supports.

For now, recruiters notice little, if any, difference in motivations for partner moves, especially those moving to and from the nine firms that made deals. According to recruiters, partners and more senior associates are more resigned to the business motivation behind the deals compared with the idealistic anger of more junior associates, Law.com has reported.

Matthew Bersani, a founding partner of Cliff Group, a legal search firm, also said he has not heard of any lateral partners taking stands against certain firms based on their deals with Trump. "I've not heard any partners who are on principle not willing to consider certain firms" because of those firms' deals with Trump, he said, adding he also hasn't heard any impact of these firms in the lateral market.

Indeed, some lateral partners in their job search don't appear to be fazed by Trump's deals, since several top Am Law 50 firms agreed to them.

"I placed one partner from a firm that was about to capitulate to the White House at a firm that just did," said a veteran legal recruiter. "The receiving firm attempted to address the deal with the partner, but the partner sort of said "eh," as if to say it had been accepted. Where else would they go unless they want to take a step down?"

Of course, there are exceptions among senior lawyers. Joseph Baio, one of the longest-practicing lawyers at Willkie, announced his exit after Willkie's deal with Trump earlier this month.

But while it's difficult to generalize across practices, transactional partners, in particular, may be more likely to believe there are existential business consequences in facing an executive order, having to face government agencies for regulatory approval of deals, and may be more likely to commit to a deal. Transactional partners at Am Law 50 are often some of the most heavily recruited partners and can quickly move to competitors if they notice tanking profits at their own firms.

The whiplashes in the economy and tariffs have placed more uncertainty into the demand for certain practices this year, including M&A and corporate work. But Bersani also said he hasn't noticed "any material change in firms' attitude" in the lateral market, including what they're looking for.

"Firms don't turn on a dime, so it's not going to be instantaneous, even if they feel like a recession is more likely," he said.

Recruiters and consultants generally acknowledged that firms are still between a rock and a hard place on the issue. Law firms already had difficulties bridging generational gaps on relatively smaller issues like office work and mentoring. That split has been exacerbated by Trump's deals with firms.

Associates have been more likely to take stands on principle against firms making deals with Trump. Junior lawyers and other

staff have resigned from firms such as Latham, Paul Weiss, Kirkland, and Simpson—all of which have made deals with the Trump administration.

Meanwhile, for the firms facing executive orders, the talent issue has factored into some court arguments. Perkins Coie's complaint argues that the executive order has "adversely affected" the firm's ability to recruit and retain employees. Some candidates, the firm's court papers said, "have questioned the economic health of the firm and whether there will be layoffs.'

Still, some of the firms facing executive orders have announced partner additions after Trump signed executive orders against the firms. That includes Wilmer Cutler Pickering Hale and Dorr, on April 2, six days after getting hit with an executive order, announcing it hired Jeremy Moorehouse, a financial services, securities, digital assets and market structure attorney, as a partner in its Washington office. He was chief legal officer at digital asset wealth management platform Lionsoul

And Perkins Coie, four days after Trump issued an executive order against the firm, said it added Arpita Bhattacharyya and Robert McCauley as partners in its IP and Patent Litigation in Palo

Wilmer, Jenner & Block, Perkins Coie and Susman Godfrey have all obtained temporary restraining orders-limiting the effect of Trump's executive orders.

they're not telling the truth." Warren Postman, of Chicagobased Keller Postman, while on a panel at Western Alliance Bank's Class Action Law Forum earlier this year, acknowledged there are some abuses in the practice.

"There are firms out there that don't do things the right way," he said But his firm consults with outside ethics counsel, he said, and, for the most part, the allegations of unethical behavior are a "tactical take" coming from the defense bar.

"In my view, it's workable, and it's done without abuse," he said.

A 'Multimillion-Dollar Shakedown'

The lawsuits follow the U.S. Chamber of Commerce Institute for Legal Reform's 2023 report called "Mass Arbitration Shakedown: Coercing Unjustified Settlements," which called on state bar associations to investigate potential ethics violations in mass arbitration.

This year, Sega filed a lawsuit in U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Virginia against Consovoy McCarthy after the firm moved to compel arbitration in Los Angeles Superior Court on behalf of nearly 20,000 individuals. Sega, in court filings, called the motion a "multimillion-dollar shakedown based on an outdated loophole in the JAMS arbitration

"Petitioners have no intention to actually litigate their claims and instead have concocted a strategy to use JAMS' filing fees—which are nearly \$40 million—to extract a quick settlement before any of their demands' deficiencies can be adjudicated," Sega attorney William Johnston, of Bird, Marella, Rhow, Lincenberg, Drooks & Nessim, in Los Angeles, wrote in the Los Angeles Superior Court case. "Many plaintiffs' firms have adopted this same shakedown strategy in recent years."

Using a "sensationalized social media campaign" that gathered information through a survey, he wrote, Consovoy McCarthy's attorneys failed to vet the claims, some of which had names like "Poop Smear" and "See Me." Only 287 claimants had any record of playing Sega's games, such as Sonic the Hedgehog, he noted.

Consovoy McCarthy partner Bryan Weir, in filings in the case, referred to the accusations as "overheated rhetoric."

"Distilled to their essence, Sega's threats to JAMS and tone in this court are really about something else: Sega thinks that mass arbitrations should be categorically prohibited," he wrote.

After losing the arbitration motion, Sega, now on the hook for \$39 million in fees, did not just sue Consovoy McCarthy. It also sued JAMS on Jan. 27 in Los Angeles Superior Court. JAMS moved to dismiss that case this month.

Weir declined to comment. But in an April 11 motion to dismiss, he called Sega's suit "beyond frivolous.3

"In other words, Sega has sued a law firm for representing its clients in successful litigation against Sega," he wrote. "That's it. That's Sega's entire case."

Sega's lawyer in the lawsuits, Craig Cardon, of Sheppard, Mullin, Richter & Hampton in Los Angeles, declined to comment. Joseph McMonigle, of Long & Levit in San Francisco, who represents JAMS, did not respond.

On Feb. 25, in the New York Supreme Court, a pair of companies that operate social gaming websites, Zula Casino, and Sportzino, sued two firms, Kind Law in Las Vegas and San Diego's Ben Travis Law. after they filed nearly 1,000 arbitration claims.

"Trying to discredit those bringing arbitration claims serves as a diversion from underlying legal issues," Brian Feldman, of Aurelian Law in Rochester, New York, wrote in a statement on behalf of the two law firms. "Plaintiffs firms stepping up to represent large numbers of consumers are ensuring access to justice that might otherwise be out of reach. Casting doubt on those firms deflects from widespread consumer harm and deters invocation of the very legal process that businesses force consumers to use in lieu of the courts."

In a prior case, filed in U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia, the gaming companies had insisted that hundreds of the arbitration claimants, who filled out an online questionnaire following a social media ad, never used their sites, agreed to arbitrate in Canada or had not authorized Kind Law or Ben Travis Law to file their claims. U.S. District Judge Paul Friedman, citing jurisdictional reasons, granted dismissal of what the arbitrating law firms called a "frivolous, vexatious, and retaliatory action."

But Lowenstein Sandler partner Gavin Rooney, in New York, who represents the two social gaming companies, SCPS LLC and SSPS LLC, told Law.com that signing up clients through social media and online ads, as is common in mass arbitration, does not work.

"What's troubling about social media advertising is it appears face-to-face contact is no longer happening, and people are being enrolled as so-called clients simply by punching a button and launching a link and entering into an attorney-client relationship simply off their iPhone," he said. "When people click the button, it was not appropriately or properly explained to them what was going to happen and what was going on."

What Do Judges Say?

So far, judges have dismissed lawsuits against plaintiffs firms and, in some cases, attempted to cool the heated arguments.

In a Feb. 24 suit in U.S. District Court for the Northern District of California, Janie and Jack alleged more than 2,400 individuals purportedly represented by Zimmerman Reed could not bring arbitration claims because they had simply visited its website.

Matthew Pearson, a partner in Irvine, California, at Womble Bond Dickinson, who represents Janie and Jack, declined to comment. Zimmerman Reed partner Caleb Marker and Jeff Westerman, of counsel, did not respond to a request for comment.

However, a similar case brought last year by cosmetics retailer L'Occitane accused Zimmerman Reed of "manufacturing frivolous arbitration claims" by representing more than 3,100 individuals who had visited its

"Simply put," wrote L'Occitane counsel Allan Anderson, a Los Angeles partner at ArentFox Schiff, in opposing dismissal of the case, "the mass arbitration schemes at issue here are entirely plaintiffs' lawyer-driven phenom-

Zimmerman Reed counsel in that case, Chase Scolnick, of Irvine California's Keller Anderle Scolnick, in a motion to dismiss, called the suit "a transparent maneuver to bypass its own arbitration provision and chill and deter claimants' pursuit of their claims."

U.S. District Judge Percy Anderson of the Central District of California dismissed L'Occitane's case and, in a footnote to his order, cautioned lawyers against attacking one another, which "damages the credibility of those engaging in such behavior."

Another judge, in a case that Tubi brought against Keller Postman last year, slammed the lawyers for such behavior, calling her job akin to a "kindergarten teacher." Tubi counsel Jenner & Block had hired a former FBI special agent to interview 19 of the 24,000 arbitrating claimants Keller Postman represented, who had opted out of a \$19.99 million class action settlement. And Keller Postman had sought to disqualify Jenner & Block.

At a Dec. 19 hearing, U.S. District Judge Ana Reyes of the District of Columbia ordered both sides to reach an agreement.

Yet both sides are due back in court on April 22.

"Unfortunately, Keller Postman is at it again," Jenner & Block partner Brandon Fox, in Los Angeles, wrote in a filing last month. Postman, in a response, wrote, "Once again, Tubi is trying to end run around arbitrations by asking this court to weigh in on ongoing JAMS proceedings.

Income Imputation in Support Calculations: An Overview

s far as social faux pas go, few are more egregious than asking someone you just met how much money they make. In the practice of matrimonial law, however, it is often one of the first things we ask new clients. At first blush, the answer may seem simple—it is listed plainly on a client's tax return. In many cases, however, the analysis is much more complicated.

If a party is unemployed, has significant assets, receives regular trust distributions or gifts, doesn't pay fair market value for their housing, or gets a one-time lump sum payout as part of their compensation, income can become one of the most disputed issues in a divorce. Because spousal maintenance and child support hinge on each party's income, those figures can impact the parties' finances for decades to come.

Legal Landscape

In New York, the Family Court Act §413 (1)(b)(5) and Domestic Relations Law §240(1-b)(e)(4) define income as what was reported on the party's most recent federal tax return, plus any unreported investment income and income from certain enumerated sources such as unemployment insurance, pensions, and alimony. Courts may also impute income to a party based on other financial resources, including without limitation:

"(a) non-income producing

(b) meals, lodging, memberships, automobiles or other perquisites that are provided as part of compensation for employment . . . ,

(c) fringe benefits provided as part of compensation for employment, and

(d) money, goods, or services provided by relatives and friends."

are vested with broad discretion to look beyond them, making the issue ripe for litigation.

Complex Cases

Unemployment/Underemployment. Sometimes a party's earnings reported on their tax return are not an accurate reflection of their earning capacity. Parties may be chronically unemployed or underemployed for many reasons, some of which courts will ascribe to them individually, and others of which courts regard as a mutual choice by the couple. For example, if a party is unemployed during the marriage because of a mutual decision to raise children, a court may be less likely to impute meaningful employment income. In some cases, however, Courts recognize that parties earn less due to their deliberate, unilateral activity and it is appropriate to impute additional income to them.

The party requesting the imputation bears the evidentiary burden and must provide a reasonable basis on which the court can order imputation. See Harlan v. Harlan, 998 N.Y.S.2d 769, 774 [Sup Ct, NY County 2014]. To be proper, courts must generate an individualized estimate based on the party's earning capacity in their job market at the time of the divorce. See D'Andrea v. Prevost, 128 A.D.3d 1166, 1167 [3d Dept 2015].

In Bianchi v. Breakell, the husband closed his construction business during the marriage and took a job with his family's contracting business instead, reducing his income. 48 A.D.3d 1000, 1002 [3d Dept 2008]. At trial, the court imputed additional income of \$80,000 to him because he was still employable in his prior field.

On appeal, the Third Department reversed, finding that, while the husband was clearly underemployed, the imputed income figure was "speculative," and not grounded in an analysis of what someone with a similar background could earn. Id.

Sometimes, a party is voluntarily underemployed as a matter of their career choices, as when a person leaves private practice for nonprofit work or government service and therefore possesses a true earning capacity that exceeds their documented income. In these cases, courts are reluctant to impute additional income in cases where the underemployment is for "valid vocational reasons," especially when there is evidence that their spouse consented, implicitly or explicitly, to the career choice. See e.g. Parmenter v. Nash, 166 A.D.3d 1475, 1476 [4th Dept 2018].

Income Fluctuations. In many cases, if a party's income varies in the years preceding the divorce, the court will average their earnings in the prior few years. In B.T. v. M.T., the husband's income fluctuated between \$750,000 and \$2.6 million in the four years before the divorce. 85 Misc.3d 1209(A) at *2, 2025 N.Y. Slip Op. 50125(U) [Sup Ct, NY County 2025]. The court averaged these figures, using an income of \$1.6 million. The purpose of averaging is to provide a reasonable evidence-backed estimate of income but avoid invit-

Herman is seeking \$67 million in damages, \$19.5 million of which is back pay. He says he was working on \$100 million in deals when he was terminated, and pulled in annual compensation ranging from \$900,000 to \$1.5 million.

The action alleges age discrimination, denial of benefits due under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act (ERISA) of 1974, use of fraud under ERISA, breach of fiduciary duty under ERISA, breach of contract, promissory estoppel, fraudulent misrepresentation, and intentional infliction of emotional distress.

"This filing is a desperate and baseless action by a disgruntled former partner," Katten said in a statement, "The Firm will vigorously contest the allegations in the appropriate venue.'

Judiciary Says 67 Judges Getting 'Enhanced Online Security Screening' **Due to Cases**

Nearly 70 federal judges are receiving "enhanced online security screening services" because of their involvement in high-profile cases or their rulings, the U.S. Judicial Conference stated in a letter last week.

The April 10 message to

House Appropriations Committee members highlighted funding shortfalls for the judiciary and various impacts, including on court security.

The letter stated the Judicial Conference has "significant concerns" about securing federal courthouses, noting the judiciary's Court Security program has been frozen at 2023 funding levels of \$750 million.

The Judicial Branch requested \$797 million for Court Security in its December 2024 funding appeal," the conference wrote. "Consecutive years of flat security funding comes at a time when threats against federal judges and courthouses are escalating, making this situation unsustainable in the current environment."

The Administrative Office of the U.S. Courts and U.S. Marshals Service are providing 67 judges with enhanced online security screening because of their involvement in cases "that have garnered attention in the media and on social media platforms," the letter stated.

The letter comes amid calls from billionaire Elon Musk and Republican lawmakers for impeaching judges who temporarily blocked challenged Trump administration actions and poli-

The letter cited Chief Justice John Roberts Jr.'s 2024 year-end report that put a spotlight on a rise in threats to the courts. The judges also noted that 50 individuals have been criminally charged in connection with threats. 'In extreme cases, the U.S. Mar-

shals Service has been required to take extraordinary measures to ensure the safety of judges," The letter stated. "We are also concerned about the impact of hiring freezes and staffing losses at the U.S. Marshals Service and General Services Administration on courthouse security and the personal safety of judges."

The letter is signed by retired U.S. District Judge Robert J. Conrad Jr. of the Western District of North Carolina, the Judicial Conference's secretary; and Judge Amy J. St. Eve of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Seventh Circuit, chair of the conference's Budget Committee. The judges said the judiciary's upcoming fiscal year budget request will be submitted this month.

Californian Nicholas Roske pleaded guilty on April 8 to attempting to murder Justice Brett Kavanaugh following the leak of a 2022 draft opinion overturning Roe v. Wade.

And U.S. District Judge Esther Salas of New Jersey—whose son Daniel Anderl was killed in 2020 by disgruntled attorney Roy De Hollander, who had argued before her and later killed himself—told NBC News this month that some of her colleagues have recently received pizza boxes in the mail bearing her son's name.

Cyber Criminals And the Gift Card Scam

raudulent schemes or more familiarly known as scams are only limited by the imagination of the scammer. One particularly virulent scam that has been in existence for some time is the so-called "gift card scam" which will be the focus of this article.

The Gift Card Platform

Credit and debit cards have a built-in limitation and risk for cyber criminals. They both have a customer name or bank account attached to them. On the other hand, gift cards have no such limitation and therefore result in a lower level of scrutiny and risk for the cybercriminal.

Further, gift cards allow cybercriminals to use a different type of payment card surface platform to study and exploit. See, e.g., United States v. Daramola, 2024 U.S. Dist. LEXIS 168969 (D. NM 2024)(gift card fraud in the context of the application of the Federal sentencing guidelines); United States v. Dzyuba, 2015 U.S. Dist. LEXIS 103746 (D. OR 2015) (defendant posing as a customer returned purchased property that was actually stolen, and fraudulently obtained gift cards in exchange from retailer); Yates v. Trump, 2019 U.S. Dist. LEXIS 213389 (N.D. OH 2019)(plaintiff sent gift cards responding to a fraudulent offer for millions of dollars by a scammer posing as the First Lady).

The Basics of the Scam

Cybercrime involving gift cards often takes the form of phishing, where criminals trick victims into providing card numbers and PINs. They may also hack gift card portals to steal and redeem balances, as well as using social engineering tactics to pressure individuals into purchasing gift cards and sharing their details.

In the latter scam, criminals may impersonate trusted contacts, like family members or authority figures such as ministers, charity officers or PTA officials, to name a few. In emails, text messages, or phone calls they try to persuade victims to purchase gift cards and provide the details to them.

In this scenario, the cybercriminals trick victims into purchasing gift cards and sharing the redemp-

tion codes, often through scams that exploit vulnerabilities or create a sense of urgency linked to an overriding "good cause." See, e.g., Anna Broadway, Christianity Today.

Similarly, one gift card scam is usually perpetrated during or close to a holiday period when the advertised "joy of giving" is relied upon by the

AF's account or obtain email addresses of members of the congregation from publicly available sources. The cybercriminal then impersonates the AF by utilizing an email very similar to the one used by the AF, so that unless the reader scrutinizes the sender's email address, the email will be accepted as that from the AF. The scam then goes into full bloom

The cybercriminal may hack the

with the cybercriminal's email detailing that the AF wants to obtain gift cards for needy members of the community, and requests the targeted person, that is, the unwary "helper," to purchase a multitude of gift cards which the purported AF will reimburse the helper for, as well as provide the helper with a healthy gift card reward for the helper.

The methodology relies on urgency, authority, and impersonation to manipulate victims into providing gift card details. The cybercriminal will then ask for the gift card number and PIN, which should set off major alarms that this is just a scam. See, e.g., Maria Ansari, Police Issue Warning About Gift Card Scam, Wave News, published June 10, 2024.

One criminal enterprise that has come to the attention of law enforcement, known as Storm-0539 utilizes covert means to conduct its fraud,

More Regulation, Foreign Taxes: Legal Tech's Trade War Worries Go Beyond Tariffs

RECENTLY imposed American tariffs threaten to harm legal tech's bottom line by raising costs for cloud computing and enterprise AI, but the bad news isn't limited to higher costs on the front end.

While the U.S. has the largest legal and legal tech markets in the world, larger vendors and e-discovery providers serve customers overseas as well. This foreign business may be at risk if trade tensions continue.

Other large economies, such as the European Union, run substantial trade surpluses in goods and deficits in services with the U.S., raising the possibility that they will turn to digital services taxes (DSTs) and non-tariff barriers to retaliate against American tariffs, which may impact the legal tech industry.

Several countries, particularly in Europe, have previously enacted DSTs, which aim to capture some of the value generated by companies that provide digital services in a country without owning assets there. While these taxes have historically targeted digital advertising and streaming video services, several proposed and enacted DSTs have covered data transmission, storage of user data and SaaS providers. Levies on these categories would likely hit at least some legal tech providers.

Non-tariff barriers can also take the form of regulations that have disproportionately large impacts on foreign companies, raising the costs of doing business overseas.

"There can be requirements that you have to have a certain local presence, and definitely in the legal sector that says, 'No, you need to have a local subsidiary, or something like that," said Ruben Dewitte, an economist with ING and a visiting professor at Ghent University.

'Also in the legal sector, where do you store the data, and under which regulation falls the storage of the data?" Dewitte continued. "There the requirements can, for instance, be that it has to be stored on servers that fall under European law, or that have to be on European servers.'

Any regulatory differences between jurisdictions can serve as a barrier to trade in services, and while many regulatory differences long predate the current turmoil, the context of the trade war may make the imposition of new barriers more

Will Legal Tech Face An 'AI Tax' in

Burgeoning Trade War?

BY BENJAMIN JOYNER

LEGAL tech companies aren't as exposed to import levies as many manufacturers and retailers, but the Trump administration's new and pending tariffs and the broader trade war they've kicked off-are likely to substantially impact the industry, regardless of their final form.

Legal tech providers and end users are likely to see higher prices driven by increasing costs for data center construction, a result of increased input costs and the high rate of artificial intelligence capital expenditures in recent years.

While legal tech companies don't tend to directly import large quantities of goods, nearly all rely on the substantial use of data centers, whether directly, through cloud providers and enterprise Al vendors, or both. The costs of data center construction are likely

to rise under the new tariff regime, as steel, building materials, and construction equipment from most countries are now subject to across-the-board 10% tariffs, a number that may rise if currently postponed tariffs go into effect.

The high tariffs applied to most goods from China will also hit the sector, as substantial amounts of construction equipment used in the U.S. originate

"Any sort of large-scale construction, whatever it might be, data centers included ... the price of making those things happen is going to go up," said Matthew Mittelsteadt, a technology policy research fellow at the CATO Institute. "Most AI systems right now, they're in the cloud, meaning they're in data centers.'

While computers and semiconductors themselves have been temporarily exempted from the enhanced tariffs on China, there's no guarantee this special status will last.

"We've heard murmurings of a chip tariff that will be specific to that product line coming down the future," Mittelsteadt said. "Data centers are essentially collections of chips and if [they] go up in price then everything goes up in price.

The increased input costs may substantially increase capital expenses for cloud computing companies and enterprise-scale AI providers, with the possibility that these increases could cause them to raise prices for customers such as legal tech companies.

This is a particularly acute issue for AI developers, who in some cases are investing hundreds of billions of dollars prior to turning profits, leaving them ill-equipped to swallow increased costs, and potentially pushing them to pass on price increases

"If we're taxing the materials that make AI possible ... [we're] making it harder for them to ultimately turn profits off of their massive, massive investments," Mittelsteadt said. "This very well could be a tax on the AI that consumers use, increasing the price of those services, and making it harder for people to want to use these products, harder to justify them in their budget lines."

Many Lawyers Don't Expect Gen AI To Bring Down Law Firm Rates

BY BENJAMIN JOYNER

CLIENTS may hold out hope that the adoption of generative AI tools will bring down the rates they pay outside counsel, but a recent survey suggests they shouldn't hold their breath.

The Thomson Reuters Institute's 2025 Generative AI in Professional Services Report, published on April 15, suggests that law firms are unlikely to change their rates in response to gen AI in the short

Over half, 53% of law firm respondents expect rates to stay the same with gen AI, while a greater share expect them to increase somewhat or significantly (20%) than expect them to fall (7%).

Steven Assie, Thomson's general manager of global & large law firms, told Legaltech News the ability for firms to do more with each hour worked, coupled with the expenses they incur in using gen AI tools, make them disinclined to lower hourly rates at the moment.

"If, in the past, it took a lawver 10 hours to complete a legal task, and now it takes them six or seven hours, they've effectively added more value for each unit of time," he said. "You might imagine then that it would be reasonable for them to actually increase their rates."

Assie added that firms are likely to use their efficiency gains from gen AI differently depending on the nature of their work. "Some firms that do bet-the-company work ... their aim is to leverage their time savings to do more work on the matter so that they can beat their competition," he said. "Another firm that's doing more transactional and/or mid-market work, they're looking to wring out as much time savings as possible

while still maintaining the quality of the work."

The report's findings come from a survey of 1,702 respondents in professional services industries, 30% of whom were from law firms, with 14% and 11%, respectively. from government and corporate legal roles. An additional 3% work for courts.

Despite the current hesitance to change rates, the news isn't all bad for clients. A plurality, 42%, of law firm respondents expect their firms to absorb the cost of gen AI tools as overhead, while only 11% expect to pass costs along to clients across the board.

"Firms are just seeing the use of technology as a way to give more value to their customers, and the way they're going to monetize that is by taking on more customers. having happier customers, and operating more efficiently," Assie said. "That's sort of the win for them in the use of the generative AI tool, not looking to cost recovery specifically for the tool."

He added that firms were also hesitant to risk running afoul of the American Bar Association's Standing Committee on Ethics and Professional Responsibility's Formal Opinion 512, which establishes reasonableness standards for billing generative Al-assisted legal work.

Part of the hesitance to change rates or pass along gen AI costs to customers may come from the fact that firms don't yet know how much value they're receiving from their gen AI investments. Around half, 51% of law firm respondents said their firms aren't measuring the return on investment (ROD) on gen AI tools, with a further 21% unsure if their firms were

Assie noted that this may be in part due to the fact that efforts to

measure ROI themselves represent a further expense for firms.

"Typically, when I'm talking to global large firms, I hear one of two methods for measuring the ROI ... either having a team compare how long it took them to do a project against an old project, or actually having two teams do the similar task," he said. "The challenge for law firms is that they bill on the hour, and that either method takes an investment of time."

Other factors for not measuring gen AI's ROI include the novelty of the technology involved, different levels of aptitude among attorneys, and the fact that some firms are still engaged in pilot projects instead of deploying tools at scale.

The report shed further light on fears gen AI presents for lawyers. Lawyers surveyed were roughly split between those who think gen AI poses no or minimal threat to the need for lawyers and their flow of work (51%) and those who believe it represents somewhat of a threat or a major threat (49%). The splits were quite similar around the scale of threat generative AI presents to firm revenues and billing practices (53%-47%).

The greatest point of anxiety in the survey was around the risk of unauthorized practice of law, which 36% of respondents deem a major threat, and even more (37%) identified as somewhat of a threat.

All of these topics are only likely to become more germane in the years to come. The report found a near doubling in the percentage of lawyers already using gen AI year-over-year, from 14% to 26%, a a significant increase that still leaves substantial room for growth going forward.

between two countries ... certain restrictions make it difficult for U.S. firms." Dewitte said. American companies must "first of all find out what is the regulation, and then actually also apply it before they come across the ocean with their services. ... Compliance is also costly, and so that's also a nontariff barrier."

By their nature, non-tariff barriers are harder to effectively target than tariffs, and their impact can be harder to calculate. However, if the trade war continues, they

may become a more appealing "From the EU standpoint, there's

a lot of potential to tax services, there you can hurt the [U.S.], but it's not so straightforward to actually do so," Dewitte said. "It's going to take a very measured approach to be able to actually select the ways that we can impose tariffs that actually hurts the U.S. firms and not the EU consumers of these U.S. trade firms.'

Efforts to develop homegrown alternatives to American frontier model developers may also hamper legal tech providers if foreign governments try to disincentivize the use of the LLMs legal tech

companies rely on in favor of supporting homegrown developers like France's Mistral.

"I think [market access] is a real problem already," said Matthew Mittelsteadt, a technology policy research fellow at the CATO Institute. "Before this trade war, AI was becoming sort of politicized in a certain respect. ... Now that America is being mean to everybody, people are probably much more likely to want to, politics aside, use whatever home-grown models they have, even if they're slightly worse."

Because of their common track record of keeping up with data compliance and governance, the Al governance torch is also often passed over to privacy professionals, Jones said.

"The GDPR data protection impact assessment is being used and leveraged toward the [EU] AI Act fundamental rights impact assessment," he used as an example. "Transparency notices are being used in ways that support

efforts to communicate to consumers, to customers and supply chains about what you are doing and how you are doing it when it comes to explainability, so there's a lot of that muscle memory and the documentation that is also being leveraged."

In terms of whether participants are confident that their organization is capable of being compliant with the EU AI Act, about half or 52% of them said they are somewhat or totally confident.

The 2025 report received its insights from 671 professionals from different organizations surveyed in the spring of 2024.

Wilson had spoken publicly about wanting to eliminate the need to have appeals re-argued by getting ahead of any potential deadlocks. He has advanced a somewhat controversial practice of vouching in judges from the state's four mid-level appellate courts, in the event that a Court of Appeals judge revealed a potential conflict of interest.

The practice has been criticized by media, particularly when Wilson's chosen replacement casts a deciding vote that aligns with Wilson's position on a matter.

An example occurred when the Court of Appeals ordered a new trial for Harvey Weinstein in April 2024, on grounds that the majority said the Hollywood mogul's 2020 rape conviction had been tainted by the trial court's admission of Molineux witnesses who testified about Weinstein's prior bad acts. Two guest judges sided with Wilson in a majority opinion by Judge Jenny Rivera.

period," said Ginsberg, who moderates panel discussions on the top court's activities, "the number of leave grants by the Court of Appeals has remained roughly consistent from year to year, meaning that, from year to year, a higher percentage of leave motions are being granted. Those facts, taken together, could be read to suggest that litigants are doing a progressively better job of vetting their cases prior to seeking leave to appeal, and making efforts to bring to the Court only those cases that fairly can be said to meet the Court's traditional criteria for leave grants, such as cases presenting state-wide legal issues on which there is a split of intermediate appellate authority."

Ginsberg said the annual report also reveals an interesting statistic about leave grants made by the Appellate Division.

In 2023, he said, only 16 cases reached the Court of Appeals via a leave grant from the Appellate Division. In 2024, that number rose sharply to 28—the highest it's been

since 2018. That increase, Ginsberg said, suggests that the Appellate Divisions "are heeding Wilson's public remarks encouraging them to scrutinize their dockets for cases that are appropriate vehicles to present and resolve the sorts of important, state-wide issues on which the Court of Appeals focuses."

The annual report also devotes more than 15 pages that summarize its most significant decisions of the year, a range of constitutional, statutory, regulatory and common-

law issues. The list included a sig-

nificant arbitration case captioned

Wu v Uber Technologies. Storm-0539, (also known as Atlas Lion), relentlessly targets gift card issuers by adapting its activities in the realm of gift card techniques to keep pace with industry changes, evolving the intricacies of its methods to attack gift card portals.

The Federal Trade Commission 2023 Databook listed 41,632 gift card fraud reports with a total loss of \$217 million dollars.

Civil Claims

In *Sharp v Long Is. Corporate Off. of Home Depot*, the plaintiff alleged in her complaint that she was deceived by a third party and induced into purchasing five gift cards from defendant and then transferring the gift cards to the third party, and that, several days after she had bought the gift cards, she learned that she had been defrauded and reported the fraud to defendant and the police.

70 Misc. 3d 132(A)(App Term, 2nd

The court determined that to establish a claim for negligence, a plaintiff must show that the defendant owed a duty to the plaintiff, that defendant breached the duty, and that such breach was the proximate cause of injury to the plaintiff. See, Pasternack v Laboratory Corp. of Am. Holdings, 27 NY3d 817, 825 (2016); Greenbaum v Bare Meats,

Inc., 178 A.D. 3d 775, 776 (2019). If there is no duty of care owed by the defendant to the plaintiff, there can be no breach and, consequently, no liability can be imposed upon the defendant" (citing Greenbaum v Bare Meats, Inc., 178 AD3d at 776; Accord Pasternack v Laboratory Corp. of Am. Holdings, 27 NY3d at 825, supra). The Court further stated:

"Here, we find that defendant did not owe plaintiff a duty of care to inquire about her purpose in purchasing the gift cards, to warn her against potential scams, or to limit the number of gift cards she could purchase. Thus, plaintiff did not have a cause of action against defendant for negligence, and the District Court properly granted defendant's motion." *Sharp v Long Is. Corporate Off. of Home Depot*,

About three years after the decision in *Sharp*, in 2023, New York enacted as an amendment to the General Business Law Section 396-i a provision related to gift card scams.

Specifically, the law requires sellers to display conspicuous notices cautioning purchasers about prepaid card scams and instructing them on how to protect themselves, thus establishing by requiring a notice, a duty of care owed to purchasers of gift cards from sellers.

Conclusion

Today's cybercriminals like criminals of the past deploy clever social engineering methodologies but have at their disposal the benefit of advanced technologies to perpetrate fraudulent schemes, evade disclosure and avoid appre-

With advanced technology available to most in our digital world, these scammers lure and defraud their victims using increasingly sophisticated digital campaigns.

It is unfortunate, but required by the times we live in, that one must always be vigilant and wary of communications seeking funding for ostensibly worthwhile causes.

The best course of action is to verify who you are dealing with before parting with your money, like the way most banks now require two levels of authentication before permitting their customers to access their online accounts.

Any suspicious communications should be reported to the Federal Trade Commission at ReportFraud. ftc.gov or your local law enforcement for investigation.

ing modification requests every time divorcing parties file taxes. *Id.*

In contrast, when a party has reported unusually high income during divorce proceedings due to some one-off windfall, the court may exclude some of it if the windfall is "paper only income," instead of true compensation. For example, in *Orofino v. Orofino*, the parties liquidated marital securities during the pendency of the divorce, resulting in capital gains, which the court excluded from income as it was "income on paper only." 215 A.D.2d 997, 998-999 [3d Dept 1995].

In *Wiltsie v. Wiltsie*, however, the husband received nonrecurring

a "multi-year pattern of parental subsidy," as opposed to "periodic gifts." The distinction hinges on the amount, frequency, and intended use of the gifts, though no single characteristic is dispositive.

The trial court in *Malkani v. Malkani* imputed income of \$84,000 to the wife because her father paid rent for her separate residence during pendency of the divorce. 208 A.D.3d 863, 865 [2d Dept 2022].

On appeal, the Second Department reversed, holding that the temporal nature of the father's contribution during the divorce and the absence of any legal duty for the father to continue paying her rent thereafter indicated that the funds were not regular income moriting imputation. Id at 866

profit-sharing plan distributions as a lump sum, which the trial court classified as extraordinary nonrecurring payments because they weren't paid "weekly or monthly." 245 A.D.2d 887, 888 [3d Dept 1997]. On appeal, the court found that this was an error, and the lump sum payment should have been included in the husband's income, because it represented part of his overall compensation. *Id*.

These cases illustrate courts' efforts to distinguish between "paper only income" and true income. True income can include lump-sum payments but in cases where the reported income is more accurately categorized as appreciation on a marital asset, courts will likely exclude it from consideration.

Assets held in trust for a party's benefit, however, are not usually considered an income source attributable to the beneficiary unless the party receives distributions. In *Blau v. Blau*, the husband was the beneficiary of trusts and the husband's father owned the parties' marital apartment. 3 A.D.3d 167, 168 [1st Dept 2005].

The trial court imputed income to the husband based on the trusts and his ability to use the apartment rent-free. *Id.* at 172. On appeal, however, the First Department reduced support and remanded the question of the father's income for further fact-finding to determine whether he received distributions from his trust or regular family gifts. *Id.*

Conclusion

Courts are vested with broad discretion to diverge from a party's reported income for purposes of support calculations when a client's tax returns don't tell the whole story. To provide informed counsel regarding their entitlement or obligation to support, it is important to holistically evaluate both parties' financial resources.

If a party is underemployed, or their income fluctuates considerably, the court may adjust its calculations accordingly by imputing a substitute figure if the record provides sufficient evidentiary support. As a result, if advising a client who intends to argue that their spouse should be imputed additional income, it is important to provide courts with detailed, contemporaneous data on which they can base their determinations.

Clients with substantial wealth in trusts should be advised that if they receive distributions from the trust during the marriage, or any other regular subsidies from a family member, they will likely be imputed additional income.

Endurance argued they were protected by privilege and Ironshore moved to compel disclosure of the unredacted claim notes. The Supreme Court denied the motion on the ground it constituted postnote discovery.

On appeal, the First Department held that Ironshore's motion should have been determined on the merits, and then addressed Endurance's privilege claims.

In doing so, the court initially recognized that the corporate designee's review of the claim notes to refresh his recollection, as he testified, was a use of documents to refresh recollection and thus triggered the disclosure right. Allied World, 234 AD3d at 585.

If the designee had merely looked at the notes, disclosure would most likely not have occurred, See, Hutter, supra, at p. 491. The court then turned to of the right in a pre-deposition preparation situation.

Second, as to the applicability of the privileges, the refreshing recollection use of a document waives any fact work product privilege otherwise applicable to the document.

The basis for this conclusion is the privilege's conditional nature, *i.e.*, the privilege is defeated if it is shown that withholding it would result in injustice or undue hard-

In essence, the basis for the waiver is the privilege itself, as depriving the cross-examiner access to the writing is an unjust result. Of note, a court has no discretion in this situation to find no waiver when the risk of unfairness is not that great when, for example, the disclosure request is a classic "fishing expedition."

Third, use of attorney-client or attorney opinion work product privileged writings to refresh recollection does not waive the privileges attached to the writing. This view is supported by their

It may be better policy to provide that a court has discretion to direct disclosure of a document used in witness or deponent preparation which is not protected by the fact work product privilege.

Ironshore's argument that this refreshing recollection use of the unredacted claim notes waived any privileges that may have attached to them.

The court disagreed. Relying on its decision in Beach v. Touradji Capital Mgt., LP, 99 AD3d 167 (1st Dept. 2012) (Abdus-Salaam, J.), the court held that only the fact work product was waived by the designee's use of them to refresh his recollection. Allied World, 234 AD3d at 585.

As to the opinion of attorney work-product privilege and attorney-client privilege claims asserted, the court held that the record was insufficient to determine whether the redacted portions were protected by those privileges and remanded the matter to Supreme Court for an in camera review to make that determination.

In so ruling, the court was recognizing that if the redacted parts were in fact protected by one of the two privileges, there was no waiver of the privileged status although used to refresh recollection

There are several takeaways from Allied World when the issue arises in the context of refreshing the recollection of a deponent before testifying at a deposition.

First, once it is established that the deponent used a writing to refresh prior to the deposition the deponent's recollection, disclosure of the document is mandated, subject to a possible privilege claim.

The rationale for holding the disclosure right to be mandatory was expressed by the Appellate Division, Fourth Department as follows: "When these notes were used by [the] defendant to refresh her recollection, they became material affirmatively used in litigation and thus removed from the protection afforded under discovery practice, because her adversary then had a legitimate interest in inspecting this material in order to conduct a meaningful examination." *Doxator* v. Swarthout, 38 AD2d 782, 782 (4th Dept. 1974).

The above stated rationale is certainly persuasive enough to support the meritorious nature

An issue not addressed by Allied World, and as well in Beach, is whether these takeaways should also be applicable to a trial witness

reviewing documents before trial. There is a dearth of case law which holds that these takeaways are all applicable to a trial witness's pre-trial preparation. See, e.g., Grieco v. Cunningham, 128 AD2d 502 (2d Dept. 1987). No principled reason

would suggest otherwise. Not at all raised or even touched upon in *Allied World* is the issue of whether the use of a privileged document while testifying at a trial or deposition waives any privilege attached to the document.

In the absence of Court of Appeals precedent on this specific issue, lower courts have held, albeit not uniformly, that the privileges are waived. See, McDonough v. Pinsley, 239 AD2d 109, 109 (1st Dept. 1991); Barker and Alexander, Evidence in New York State and Federal Courts (2d ed) §§5:10, 5:16.

This view is commendable as a waiver rule is necessary to ensure fairness of the trial process, as noted in a highly praised decision by the Massachusetts Supreme Judicial Court in Commonwealth v. O'Brien, 645 NE2d 1170, 1175 (Mass. 1995), which would occur in the absence of an opportunity by the adverse party to examine the document used to refresh rec-

An overall landscape can now be charted. Use of a document protected by a privilege to refresh the recollection of a trial witness or deponent while testifying, waives any privilege that may attach to the document, and disclosure of the document to the adverse party is mandatory.

And use of a document protected by a privilege to refresh the recollection of a witness or deponent during pre-trial or pre-deposition preparation waives the fact work product privilege, but not an attorney-client or attorney opinion privilege applicable to the document, and as to the former disclosure of the document is mandated.

Overall, these rules are commendable with one exception. It may be better policy to provide that a court has discretion to direct disclosure of a document used in witness or deponent preparation which is not protected by the fact work product privilege.

As can be gleaned, this landscape can be a trap for the unwary attorney, especially in the witness and deposition preparation stage of an action where an attorney may through in advertence, or ignorance, permit discovery of otherwise privileged documents.

Furthermore, the case law in many instances is conflicting, and in need for uniformity. While the Court of Appeals is the way to establish applicable common law rules, this may not occur now when clear rules are needed. Hence, the need for legislative action.

As mentioned before Senator Hoylman-Sigal has introduced S.6128 which codifies the aforementioned rules, with proper reform and guidance as to their application. His bill is set forth in a proposed CPLR §4550, with three subdivisions.

Subdivision (a) mandates the disclosure of any document or material used to refresh the recollection of a witness while testifying at a trial or hearing, or at a deposition. It also provides that such refreshing recollection use of the document or material waives all claims of privilege.

Subdivision (b) governs a witness's or deponent's use of a document or material to refresh a trial witness's or deponent's recollection before testifying at a trial, hearing or deposition.

It provides that a court has discretion to permit disclosure of the document or material used to refresh recollection "in the interests of justice," disclosure not being mandated.

Subdivision (b) also provides that the privileged nature of the document or material does not bar disclosure but is a factor to be considered in the court's determination of whether to permit disclosure.

Of note, unlike in Allied World, disclosure of attorney-client and attorney opinion work product may be ordered to be disclosed. As written subdivision (b) is hardly an invitation to override as a matter of course these privileges, especially as to attorney-client and attorney opinion work-product.

Rather it is expected that such disclosure will be a rare occurrence limited to exceptional circumstances where there is real need for the adverse party to see the document or material.

Subdivision (c) sets forth guidelines for a court to follow when directing disclosure under subdivision (a) or subdivision (b).

They include allowing the adverse party to use the document or material to cross-examine the witness and introduce into evidence those portions of the document or material that relate to the witness's testimony.

Senator Hoylman-Sigal's bill codifies and reforms present law to achieve just and workable rules. It deserves the support of the bar.

certain amount of digital assets to become an active validating node for a blockchain network, which can increase the holder's return on investment.

Chow promised investors that M3M3's offering would lead to a domino effect in which there would be a reduction in price volatility and an increase in overall market capitalization and that investors in every digital asset that participated in M3M3 would be protected from pump-and-dump schemes and sharp drops in market price shortly after that asset's launch, according

to the complaint. The M3M3 platform then announced the launch of a new digital asset, \$M3M3; however, the plaintiffs alleged that the defendants "deliberately concealed their involvement" from the public, including offering, promoting and

selling to plaintiffs and hundreds of other investors. "In reality, \$M3M3 was a blatant fraud jointly planned and perpetrated by Meteora, Kelsier, and the individual defendants," the

plaintiffs alleged in the 45-page The plaintiffs alleged the defendants "covertly orchestrated the purportedly public launch of \$M3M3 on Meteora to limit initial sales to defendants" and a group of insiders using 150 electronic wallets. And soon after the launch. the insider investors unloaded their tokens on the noninsider investors, eventually leading to a crash on Dec. 6, according to the complaint. While the insider investors made strategic attempts to regain investor confidence by re-inflating \$M3M3's value, the token ultimately plum-

Because there is limited time available between the primary election sessions of the Appellate Division Departments and the Court of Appeals, parties who seek to have matters placed upon the Court of Appeals motions or appeals calendars must contact the Court of Appeals Clerk's Office for filing instructions promptly (usually immediately upon release of the Appellate Division decision).


